TIME SENSITIVE: INDY PARKS HIRING INCENTIVES

Indy Parks is offering new hiring incentives, as part of a wider effort to attract summer job applicants. The following bonuses are now available to current and part-time seasonal employees:

- "Early Bird" Sign-on Bonus: New and returning seasonal employees will receive a \$200 bonus once 100 hours have been worked. To be eligible, candidate must submit all hiring paperwork and be registered for all required trainings by TOMORROW, APRIL 9.
- "Early Bird" Referral Bonus: Part-time seasonal and part-time yearround Indy Parks staff are eligible for a \$200 bonus for referring a new hire after the new hire completes all required trainings and completes 100 hours of work during the 2022 summer season. To be eligible, candidate must submit all hiring paperwork and be registered for all required trainings by TOMORROW, APRIL 9.

Indy Parks is hoping to hire for more than 400 positions for the summer season. Positions eligible for the bonus programs include assistant program coordinators, camp counselors, cashiers, head lifeguards, lifeguards, pool managers, and seasonal pool facility attendants. Both new and returning seasonal employees qualify for the bonus programs.

Those applying for lifeguard positions must be at least 16 years old, pass a lifeguard test, and attend training. Scholarships are available to help cover the training cost. The pools at Thatcher Park and Indy Island Aquatic Center are open for applicants to practice their lifeguarding skills for free before their test. Applicants are asked to speak with a hiring manager about their desired pool placement before coming in to practice.

ELEVATION GRANTS

OPHS has partnered with The Indianapolis Foundation, an affiliate of the Central Indiana Community Foundation, to administer \$15 million in grants for 2022. Renamed in 2022 as the Elevation Grant Program, this initiative represents a nearly five-fold funding increase towards neighborhoodbased organizations working to empower the community and address the root causes of crime.

The \$15 million in 2022 will be split up into multiple grant rounds. The first grant round opens April 1 and will award grants to organizations addressing the following categories:

- Thriving Neighborhoods community building
- Empowered Youth prevention
- Restoration and Resilience mental wellness
- Infrastructure Development capacity building

Eligible organizations are grassroots organizations, defined as an entity operating under community values, shared power, and decision making, and supported by an organizational budget up to \$250,000. Priority in this round will be given to not-for-profits led by the residents of the communities they serve. In addition, organizations must demonstrate the use of data-based methods for addressing the root causes of violent crime.

SUSTAIN INDY ELECTRONICS RECYCLING EVENT

The Indianapolis Office of Sustainability (Sustain Indy) and RecycleForce will host an electronics recycling ("E-cycle") event on Saturday, April 23 at Krannert Park (605 S High School Road) from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Led by staff from the Indianapolis Department of Public Works – Environmental Resources Management team, this is the second special recycling event focused on electronics offered thus far in 2022. A similar event in January saw 600 residents bring a total of 30 tons of recyclables to Garfield Park for disposal.

COLLEGE AVENUE BRIDGE CLOSURE

The Indianapolis Department of Public Works (Indy DPW) closed a portion of College Avenue over the Central Canal north of Broad Ripple Avenue this week for bridge maintenance. It is expected to reopen this fall.

Northbound traffic will be directed to follow Kessler Boulevard, Meridian Street and 71st Street to reconnect with College Avenue during the closure. Southbound traffic should use 71st Street, Meridian Street and Kessler Boulevard. North and southbound traffic will be directed to travel across the Kessler Boulevard bridge over White River that is currently under construction. Two-way traffic across the Kessler Boulevard bridge is restricted to the northernmost traffic lanes. Westfield Boulevard will remain open for traffic traveling northeast along the Central Canal during construction.

The nearly \$674,000 project includes partial removal and replacement of bridge decking and installation of new overlay. Existing sidewalks on either side of the bridge will be widened for improved pedestrian safety and connectivity. For more information, visitindy.gov/dpw.

BROAD RIPPLE AVE REDESIGN GROUNDBREAKING

Mayor Joe Hogsett joined the Indianapolis Department of Public Works on March 29th to break ground on improvements coming to Broad Ripple Avenue. In a joint partnership between the Broad Ripple Village Association and the City through the Indianapolis Neighborhood Infrastructure Partnership, \$6.73M will fund improvements from College to Primrose avenues, including a new "River Walk" that will connect Broad Ripple Park to the Monon Trail.
