NEIGHBORHOOD GRANTS PROGRAM

The City of Indianapolis Neighborhood Grants Program is designed to support the engagement, collective action, and increased development of all neighborhoods and neighborhood-based organizations. This program seeks to reinforce the strengths and assets within Indianapolis' neighborhoods by providing financial resources for projects and activities that are designed to increase resident engagement, promote neighborhood action, and establish new and stronger relationships among neighbors, grassroots organizations, and other stakeholders.

IMPORTANT QUALIFICATION INFORMATION:

The program is available to Registered Neighborhood Organizations within Marion County and located within a <u>Qualified Census Tract</u> and/or within a ZIP Code that was negatively impacted by COVID-19 (as defined by the <u>SAVI's COVID-19 Impact Score</u>). A map is provided on the following page.

Applicants may request grants from \$2,500 to \$10,000. Applicants must provide proper documentation of project expenditures greater than or equal to the amount requested within 12 months from the receipt of grant funds.
